Traffic Light System

Procedure for not following rules



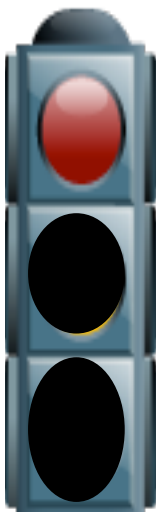
Green light

Sanction 1. Make this the point that you try to move on from the behaviour.



Amber light

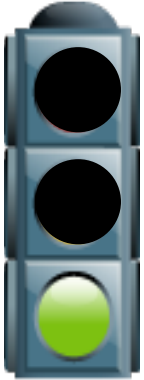
Sanction 2,3,4. Behaviour still hasn't improved give them 3 choices at this stage to change the behaviour



Red light

Sanction 5. Make this the point where the behaviour stops

Rules for non compliance Traffic light system



1. You will be given the choice to change your behaviour

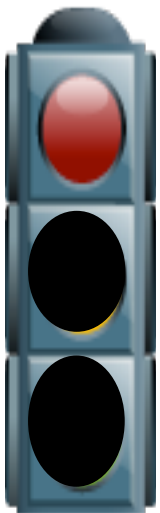


2. If you choose to continue with the behaviour your tutor will speak to you during break time

(If the behaviour happens after last break you will be spoken to at first break time the following day)

3. If you still choose to continue with the behaviour you will lose your free time on a Friday so you can complete your work

4. If you still choose not to change your behaviour a phone call home will be made and a meeting arranged to discuss your behaviour



5. If you choose not to follow these rules then we will have no choice but to remove you from the lesson for an agreed period of time which may seriously affect your coursework
