



Procedure for Non-Compliance

1. At the first sign of non-compliance reinforce your school rule and expectations. Explain the sanction if the child does not comply (i.e. how many points they will lose) and give the child a choice with 'take up time' to correct their behaviour. Walk away or return to what you were doing. If the child corrects their behaviour in the time allotted, acknowledge with praise and try to catch them doing something right soon after.
2. If the child has not changed their behaviour after 'take up time' the sanction is given and, depending on the child and situation, they will either be told immediately or the incident will be 'marked and parked', with the child being told at a more appropriate time when they are away from the whole class. Give lots of praise to children who are doing the right thing and do not get embroiled in negotiation with the child.
3. If the child continues to break the rules in a way that is dangerous or disruptive to the learning, repeat the procedure, giving the child a second choice and appropriate sanctions for the escalation of non-compliance in accordance with the school's behaviour policy.

4. Before removing the child from the situation/lesson, warn them that if they continue, they will be issued with a 'red card' and explain why this measure is necessary i.e. disrupting the learning of the other children in the class. Remind the child of the severity of the sanction and implications i.e. involvement of the Head Teacher, detention, parents being called into school. Give the child a choice, allow 'take up time' and follow through with the final sanction if they do not comply.
